

#### Book Launch - 'Fine Spirit and Pluck'

World War One history came alive at the Eltham Library for the book launch on 6<sup>th</sup> August 2016. Yarra Plenty Regional Library in partnership with Nillumbik Shire Council presented a touring exhibition from the State Library exploring the personal stories of ordinary Australians told through their own photographs, letters, diaries and writings. The stories have been gathered from the municipalities of Banyule, Nillumbik and Whittlesea – stories that help us connect us to our past and offer a sense of place in the community in which we live, and which exemplify the fine spirit and pluck exhibited by every Australian. It is a collection of snapshots into the past, an anthology that commemorates the Australian spirit and which is sure to touch every reader.



A small group had a day in Bendigo to visit the Marilyn Monroe Exhibition. To catch the 8a.m. from Spencer Street, we had to leave home while it was still dark.

The displays carried lots of information on Marilyn's life and the costumes and were very interesting. Gowns worn in her movies were beautiful and the gold lamé dress worn in 'Gentlemen Prefer Blondes' still remains an iconic Marilyn style moment. The interesting story is that they had to sew it into position when she had it on. After absorbing so much Marilyn, we wandered through Rosslyn Park to the Golden Dragon Museum and Classical Gardens and on our way, we stopped for lunch and celebration birthday cake as we had four birthday people with us.

After lunch we toured the Golden Dragon Museum and the Yi Yuan (Garden of Joy) which proved to be a fascinating glimpse of Victorian history.
