IMPACT OF COVID-19 VIRUS ON WHITTLESEA U3A MEMBERS

It is understood that the need to physical distance and self-isolate will be with us for some time. The virus is particularly contagious and if its spread is not slowed it will put unimaginable stress on our health system. At this time there is no know 'fix to the problem' In the meantime, to governments in Australia have implemented measures to try and minimise the percentage of the populations that are sick at the same time. The measures, such as self-isolating, social distancing, restricting travel, and closing of meeting venues and cafes are having an impact on our way of life. Our members and seniors in the community generally are feeling the effects in a number of different ways. U3As in the U3A Network in Victoria have in suspended classes and activities which means face to face contact has ceased for the time being. The issue now is how can members stay connected during this time. The concern of course is if seniors are isolating themselves which we are required to do it has the potential to increase the risk of social isolation and loneliness. Our organisation is recognised as a "safety net" for many people to prevent isolation and loneliness. The Department of Health and Human Services Seniors, Ageing and Carers Health and Wellbeing section is supporting U3A to offer classes online using a technology platform called zoom. The Tutors of Creative Writing, E Publishing, Tell Your Story, Laptop Windows, African Violet Propagation classes are now continuing as online access from home classes. from home.

Over the next two weeks Tutors who lead the iPad, Computer Classes, some Exercise Classes, Photography, Family History will be contacting their class members to invite them to participate in their classes by accessing from home. We fully understand that not all members have the skills to use devices to access the internet to participate in classes from home. To provide those members with the opportunity to maintain contact with fellow class members we are implementing "wellbeing connector" teams to maintain contact with members by phone.

In consultation with Tutors we are providing Tutors with the support to maintain contact by phone through a "phone buddy" during the time you would normally attend classes

The telephone buddy system is being developed to keep in touch with those members who are not e-connected.

As treasurer of Whittlesea U3A, I will continue the use of cheques for the purposes of refunding members. Payment via cheque will continue, until further notice.

The option of transferring monies electronically, is also available. If choosing this option, Whittlesea U3A, will require the following from member requesting refund:

Please be advised that your account details will be securely managed, as per Whittlesea U3A privacy policy.

Your BSB and Account numbers, will only allow Whittlesea U3A access to deposit money into your chosen account. This information does **not** allow Whittlesea U3A to withdraw money.

Advantages of Electronic Funds Transfer [EFT] are: -

Transaction time is faster. The money is in your account within hours, [minutes if the banking network has no delays], money can also be transferred on weekends and public holidays.

You don't have to queue in a bank to deposit a cheque.

You don't have to wait 2 – 3 working days for the cheque to clear.
