QUARRY HILLS SENIOR STEWARDS PROGRAM

After the success of the conservation program that was conducted last year by the members of the City of Whittlesea's Conversation team we are starting a series of talks led by Tim Connell (Unit Manager of Conservation) where he will share his deep appreciation of Quarry Hills Regional Parkland.

Quarry Hills stands out as the municipality's largest parkland, boasting a diverse landscape that encompasses granitic outcrops, woodlands, grasslands, ephemeral wetlands and more. Come along to this Speakers' Discussion Group session (refer to the dates below)



to learn more about this beautiful landscape where manna gums and stringy barks stand, wattles bloom, and the smell of tea-trees fill the air. You will find Gliders in remnant tree hollows, Kangaroos resting in open grasslands, skinks basking on stony rises, and frogs serenading from wetlands.

Afterward, stick around for a discussion on how you can play a part in the conservation and restoration efforts of this remarkable place.

This first of 3 monthly session to be held as part of the Speakers' Discussion Group will be on Monday 18th March.
