A recently retired man approached a library staff member about how to occupy himself now that he has nothing to do during the days ahead. The library staff member turned to Peter Rodaughan who was hosting a Tech Café for Seniors session for assistance. Peter introduced himself to the man and informed him about Whittlesea U3A and the Tech Cafe. He decided that he needed help with using a computer and his Android Mobile 'phone. The man returned the following week and was shown how to access a library computer, use a computer mouse and keyboard to access the internet. He commented that this was his first experience in using a computer. He is now being assisted in purchasing an inexpensive computer for PC Australia. The man has joined Whittlesea U3A and has a Yarra Plenty Regional Library card.

A lady visited Thomastown Library for assistance in helping her turn on and use a new mobile phone her son had bought for her and was referred to Peter Rodaughan by library staff. She told Peter that her son had transferred data from her old G3 'phone to the new phone but she could not turn it on. The battery was flat and Peter identified that she required a new charger for the cable her son had given her with the phone. The lady can now charge the battery in her mobile phone and has started to use it. She has joined Whittlesea U3A and has returned for more assistance in the use of her mobile phone.
