



All seniors should have a Will. An Enduring Power of Attorney (EPOA) allows you to appoint someone to make financial and personal decisions – such as paying bills or choosing where you live – if you no longer have capacity to make them yourself. You can only make an enduring power while you still have the capacity to make your own decisions.

EXPERIENCING INTERNET DROPOUTS OR SLOW WI-FI SPEEDS

Can be frustrating. But did you know that there's a few things you can do, that make a BIG difference to your WI-FI quality.

Here are some tips to optimise your internet setup and ensure you get the best possible speeds.



Keep your modem central

Wi-Fi range and speed and can be greatly affected by your modem's location. Place your modem centrally in your home to ensure a strong signal.



Watch out for signalinterfering objects

Avoid placing your modem/router behind solid walls, large electrical appliances, as well as in a cabinet/shelf.



Consider the number of devices connected

Ensure your modem supports the number of devices in your home to prevent connectivity issues.



Switch to 5G network

For better Wi-Fi speed, and to reduce interference connect to the default 5GHZ Wi-Fi network. You can find the name and password printed on your modem.



Check the Wi-Fi light is on

Confirm that the Wi-Fi button is not off on your modem. If it's off, your Wi-Fi won't work.



Wi-Fi not working on one device?

Try using another device to see if you get a better connection. If the connection improves, it's likely an issue with your original device.

Telstra's 3G network is closing

Don't wait – our 3G network is closing from 28 October 2024. You'll be impacted by the network closure, so act now to ensure you remain connected.

What does this mean for you?

The device/s listed below will not be able to access the Telstra mobile network after our 3G closure from 28 October 2024. This means you will not be able to make any calls including calls to triple zero from 28 October 2024.

To ensure your service/s are not impacted, it's important you act now by upgrading your device to a compatible device. Visit our <u>3G closure page</u> for more information.

If you have recently taken action to ensure your device compatibility you can disregard this notice.

Important: Device Compatibility

Before you upgrade, make sure your new device is compatible with the 4G 700 MHz (B28) band. To check whether your device is compatible, SMS '3' to '3498' or refer to our 3G closure page here:
